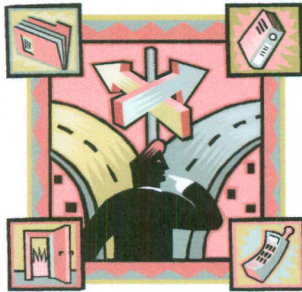


Your Right to be Informed About the Most Integrated Setting

Did you know there is a law that gives you the right to make choices in your life and the supports you get?

In 2005, a bill was passed so that people who receive services funded by DDA have the right to be informed about the Most Integrated Setting. That means that you have the right to be told about all the choices you could make about your life and the supports you receive.



What does it mean to have a choice?

When you can pick from different things in different parts of your life. You have a chance to do something that you normally wouldn't do.

SELF DIRECTION

You have a right to make choices about the little things in your life, like what to eat and watch on TV.

You have the right to make big choices, like where to live and work.

Do you have a say in making a choice?

Do people ask you what you want to do?

Or does someone just tell you what to do.

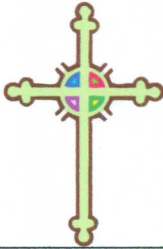

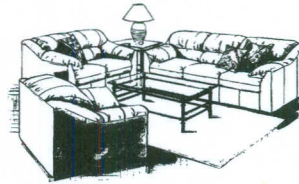
